Phyllis' Ponderings

A Call to Support Women of the ELCA from your SWO President

We were not prepared to "be WELCA" during a pandemic so our Circle Leaders, our Unit Leaders, our Conference Leaders, and our Synodical Leaders are often struggling to find ways to include everyone—those who are once again meeting in person without forgetting those who aren't joining those in person meetings for whatever reason. I am grateful for all of you as you travel this new and challenging road. I also encourage you to share things you are doing to encourage and support your community of women with our *Tapestry* Editor, Linda Greilick.

Faith reminds us that God is always with us, walking beside us, holding us in the palm of His hand, and whispering in our ears with words of encouragement and, maybe, giving us new ideas about how we can do things—how we can grow and change during this very unusual season of our lives.

One of our challenges has been financial. Talking about money is not comfortable or easy, but this organization exists because of your financial support. What does your financial support look like for this organization?

- Spring Gathering Offerings & Registration Fees We were not able to have our Conference Meetings, so the Synodical Women's Organization didn't receive that offering. Did you know that we use that offering you send us to pay travel expenses for your Conference President to attend our January Board Meeting? While at the meeting, she can share what you are doing in your Conference and hear what others are doing, get ideas, help plan Spring Gathering, participate in Bible Study and worship with the SWO Board, give us valuable feedback, hear about the upcoming Fall Gathering, etc. We also use that Spring Gathering offering to help reimburse your Board Representative for her travel expenses to attend your Spring Gathering (many of your Board Members did not ask to be reimbursed).
- Regular (Circle) Offerings Traditionally, a regular offering is received at our Circle Meetings with the Unit Treasurer forwarding part to the SWO Treasurer. The SWO Treasurer then forwards 55% to our Churchwide Women's Organization (CWO). When you make a regular offering, you are supporting the ministries of your Unit, the ministries of the SWO, and the ministries of the CWO. What does the SWO and CWO do with your offerings? Within the SWO, we try to keep our operating expenses to a minimum. No one on the Board is paid, but we do like to be able to reimburse a Board Member for travel or other out-of-pocket expenses if she

makes the requests. She is giving us her time, and we would never want any woman to feel she could not share her gifts with us because she doesn't have the financial means. One of the most valuable things the CWO does with our offerings are all those resources that someone takes the time to write and make available for us. The staff is also always more than ready to answer questions or help in other ways.

- Share the Spirit and Let Your Light Shine Scholarships Offerings— These scholarships help women
 of all ages attend our Fall Gathering. Without your financial support for these two scholarships,
 some of our ladies, both young and old, would not be able to attend. (A personal thank you for your
 support of these scholarships: I didn't have the money to attend one year so because of your faithful and generous support, I could attend; and no one knew until now).
- Fund for Leaders Scholarship Offerings— Your support of this scholarship helps offset a small portion of the expense of attending seminary. Over the years, your support has helped so many who are now serving the ELCA as rostered leaders. To date, we have helped 11 women.
- Fall Gathering Offerings Each year, we receive a "Convention Offering" during our Eucharist Service with 50% staying within the SWO and 50% going to the CWO. We also receive a Love Offering. I encourage you and your Unit to prayerfully consider making both a Convention Offering and a Love Offering.

When our lives were turned upside down, the financial support of our organization was very much impacted, and when we made the very difficult to decision to cancel this year's Fall Gathering, we lost our deposit for this year's Gathering. We will be able to make the deposit for the 2021 Fall Gathering when it's due, but it will leave us with very little in reserves.

I am calling on each one of you to take some time to prayerfully consider what this organization means to you and what your life would be like without WELCA, without this community of sisters. Then, if this organization is an essential part of your life and it is important to you for WELCA to continue, I'm challenging you to make at least a regular offering or to increase your regular offering. If you can make an offering to one (or more) of our scholarships and/or to our Love Offering, thank you! Your support will be a blessing, not just to the organization but to so many other women.

Many of us are on fixed incomes. We often use that as a reason for not giving. But stop and think about that—you have an income; you know how much you are receiving each month. There are people right now who would be incredibly thankful and feel blessed to have the assurance of a certain amount of income each month. Perhaps you could share the blessing of having a fixed income and make a small offering? Remember we serve a God who fed thousands with just a few fish and a few loaves of bread...so even if you can only make a small offering, He will be able to do amazing things with your gift.

Hello Ladies,

I have been in contact with *Wanda Siefke*, the secretary at CALM. In March they made the decision that it was too risky to take any new applicants into their program. However, since then (June 1) they have reopened the application process. Covid-19 has greatly impacted them by increasing their need for PPE and extra cleaning supplies. Since there is no school, extra babysitters are necessary and therefore the need for much of these extra supplies. Covid concerns caused them to not be able to rent their on-site venue to outside businesses, causing a loss of revenue. Even though they have been financially impacted, it has not stopped them from serving their community. During isolation, they allowed musicians to come in one at a time and record performances that were broadcast over Facebook. Local craft artisans were provided a free venue with social distancing for local community members to attend. They are collecting school supplies for a drive-thru give away happening August 15; any extra supplies will be donated to local schools.

What do they need from us?

- 1) Prayers for the wisdom to lead the organization into the unknown future
- 2) God's protection for all their residents and volunteers that they stay healthy and safe
- 3) Any monetary donations possible would be very appreciated due to their loss of income due to loss of rental revenue
- 4) As do most people, they need cleaning supplies, paper products, personal hygiene items, etc.

They have a church that was meeting at the local High School looking to rent their venue and live stream services. However, the rental property has minimum bandwidth internet which is not sufficient for that usage. Installation upgrades would be \$750 and the monthly service fees would be \$715. The income generated by this rental would be \$1,000 per month.

I wish that we could meet their financial needs with a sizeable donation, but as with all organizations and small businesses we are all struggling to make ends meet and survive this pandemic. I do know that as Women of the ELCA we can pray for them. Pray that God keeps them all safe and healthy, pray that God guides their leadership, and pray that somehow they are able to make ends meet during this difficult time.

Global Mission Table News August 2020

The Global Mission Table (GMT) met by ZOOM on August 24, 2020. Reports from the five Companion Church Committees are outlined below.

Cuba is our newest companion church. *Rev. Dr. Russell Meyer*, head of the Cuba task force, reported that the situation in Cuba is deteriorating due to the regressive policies of the U.S. Government. Cuba has a new monetary system which can only be used in state owned stores, and the U.S. government will not allow U.S. dollars to be spent in these stores. The ELCA is working with the United Church of Canada (a Presbyterian connection) to funnel money to Cuba. The World Council Of Churches is trying to act as a bridge. Cuba did receive a COVID grant.

Haiti – *Alonzo Batson* is the head of the Haiti Task Force. There have been a couple of meetings with Haiti. The Haiti team is trying to emphasize the importance of records, even if they are informal ones. *Pastor Livenson* reported that Emmanuel Lutheran of Venice is sending COVID supplies but they had not yet been received as of August 24th. He indicated that customs fees will need to be paid and Alonzo reported that along with customs fees, in order to pick up the supplies, ELH *(Evangelical Lutheran Church in Haiti)* will a need documentation stating it is an official religious institution.

Jamaica – *Judy Olsen* is the Task Force Leader. *Pastor Khader* reported that the work on the sponsored class-

room is progressing. It is almost finished and pictures of the progress will be sent out soon.

Guyana and Suriname – Task Force Leader is *Marcee Wilkes*. Their churches have been closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. They are slowly starting to reopen. There was a meeting earlier in August with FB mission leaders and representatives from Guyana. There has not been much action between the FB Synod and these two companions since the virus started. We are hopeful to be able to work together soon.

YAGM (Young Adults in Global Mission) — Many of you will remember the young woman Ashley Fyle from the YAGM program who served in Australia and attended our Fall Gathering in 2018. She gave an interesting talk about her experiences there doing God's work. YAGM is on "sabbatical" this year, due to COVID. However, donations can still be made to the ELCA for this program. GMT approved a \$1000.00 donation.

PJ May has done an excellent job for the last several years as chair of the GMT in Florida Bahama Synod. She has decided to retire, and this was her last meeting as chair. She will remain on the Cuba and Jamaica Task Forces. She welcomed **Pastor Katie Carroll** to the leadership of the Global Mission Table and told us all good-bye.

In ordinary times, women gather in our circles and congregational units, and when we do, we give **Regular Offerings**. These are living proof of our interdependence – the congregational unit's treasurer keeps a share of the offering for the unit's own ministries and forwards the rest to the synodical women's organization; the SWO treasurer keeps a share of that for its own ministries and forwards the rest to the churchwide organization. Regular Offerings are *really* powerful.

But these aren't ordinary times, are they? If we aren't able to gather in our circles and congregational units, how can we give to support the organization we love, in all its expressions? It's simple. Make out a check to Women of the ELCA, write "Regular Offering" on the memo line, and – instead of handing our offering to our congregational unit treasurer in person -- mail it to her. She will deposit the checks and write one Regular Offering check just like always, fill in a copy of Form A just like always, and mail it to her synodical treasurer just like always. It's good to know some things only change a little!

The scholarship will be awarded by the decision of the FL-BA SWO board at their January 2021 board meeting using the following criteria:

- The applicant must be a student in the candidacy process attending one of the eight ELCA seminaries in either the Master of Divinity or Master of Arts program, or a student in an approved extension program of one of the ELCA seminaries and be enrolled in an approved program, such as the Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM) program.
- Preference will be given to residents of the Florida-Bahamas Synod.
- Preference will be given to female applicants.
- Preference will be given to an active member of a congregational unit of the Women of the ELCA.
- Applicant should exhibit faith qualities that empower others.
- Applicant should demonstrate leadership qualities in church and the community.
